The call commenced at 10:01 AM on Monday, November 23, 2009.

Hilary Brazzell began the call by taking roll and inviting other participants to introduce themselves. She gave a high-level overview of how the system might work using iBudgets.

She and Alex Hall then described the options generally.

The group then discussed the handouts (attached) point by point.

Hilary then described some options regarding waiver support coordination services. One thought is to keep what are essentially three levels--limited, full, and transitional--but revise who can access what types of services. Some people might have more flexibility to access different levels, while some might have less (for instance, people who joined the waiver in crisis, or people who overspent might be required to have full or transitional (which we might call "enhanced")
Hilary also described the Georgia system, which offers some flexibility in sharing tasks among the waiver support coordinator and individual and family Comments on these issues included:

It would be scary for a waiver support coordinator to not know what's going on; for instance, if don't have contact for months at a time. Have seen natural supports exploit individuals, so it's good to have an outside view.

If consumers and families had electronic access to records, that would help them manage their services themselves; would be less they'd have to talk to the waiver support coordinator about.

Waiver support coordinators will need to spend lots of time with individuals and families at the beginning to help them understand how the new system works. As some consumers and families

get more proficient, they may need less waiver support coordinator time.

Enhanced services and rate would be good for those with no extended family to help; hopefully the waiver support coordinator would bring more natural supports into the picture. Concern on a consumer/family sharing tasks with a waiver support coordinator like the Georgia option. Providers need to be able to know who to call to work our problems. Due to confidentiality requirements, cannot put certain issues in case notes; need to speak in person.

The call ended at about 11:35 AM.

Comments from workgroup members:

Some consumers can't cut back on some services like personal care, so what is the benefit of being able to switch among them?

Some consumers also won't be able to manage their services and make good choices. They need help. For instance, if they went without supported living, they would get into financial, legal, or medical emergencies. An example is having their kids taken from their home because they're not caring for them properly.

Under current system some consumers need help and don't have it. We'll need to find guardian advocates for some, for instance.

Generally like the basic service family groupings here and the overall structure and design.

Recommend not grouping supported living with adult day training and employment; are meeting different needs and shouldn't be competing with one another.

Is a concern that this structure would make consumers more vulnerable to provider manipulation; however, this probably is a separate issue to be dealt with in another workgroup.

Do like the new services and the help they'd offer to bring in more unpaid supports.

Concern that hours would vary too much and there would be no set schedule. Recommendation would be to still have schedules set that could vary slightly.

Discussion regarding consumers and families' likely preferences to vary schedules day to day and week to week. It's unknown, but thinking is that they'd prefer to have set schedules but change service mix over a longer term as needs change.

Comments from Workgroup Members:

This is in the spirit of flexibility that's a goal of the initiative.

Recommend moving more of the home-based services into "Places to Live" grouping.

These are the main categories that people might use when planning a budget--are common-sense.

Thought that person-centered planning is the role of the waiver support coordinator; that service is unnecessary. If Idea behind the Person-Centered Planning service is to offer opportunities for individuals to access providers with special training who would put a good deal of time and effort into understanding individual's goals and situation and develop a thorough, tailored plan for that person.

Concern that people will run out of budgeted hours even when needs are there (such as in supported living, where providers handle emergencies).

This system may help in that circumstance, since individuals would be able to increase their hours themselves by reducing in other areas or have unspent funds they can use.
